- The percentage in full-time employment is below average (44.2% in Bride Valley and 51% across Dorset).
- Bride Valley's population aged 16+have higher qualifications than the County average. 20.5% have no qualifications, lower than the Dorset figure (21.3%) whilst 31% have higher qualifications (degree or above), above the average (27%).
