- Self-employment is low, this group makes up just 12.8% of the economically active population in Broadwey, the County average is 18.4%.
- Unemployment is higher than average, 5.4% of those economically active are unemployed compared with 4% across Dorset.
- Of those economically inactive Broadwey has a high proportion looking after home/family (14.7%) and who are permanently sick or disabled (15.5% compared with 9.7% across Dorset).
