- Over a quarter of those aged 16+ have no qualifications, significantly higher than the County average (21%). Only 17% have higher level qualifications (degree or above), lower than the average (27%).
- Burton Grange division has a low proportion of people employed in high skill occupations, 29% compared with 40% across Dorset.
