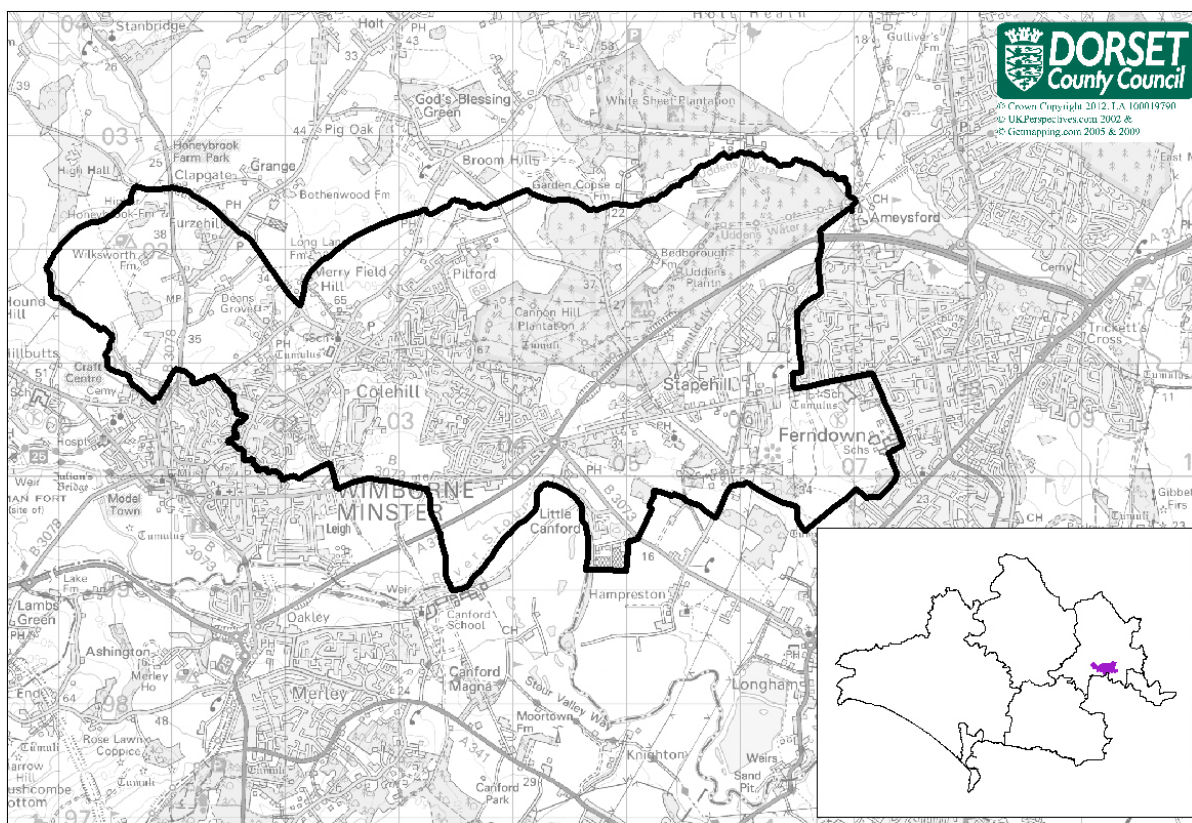


Electoral Division Profile 2013

- Colehill & Stapehill Electoral Division is composed of the following wards: Colehill East, Colehill West and Stapehill.
- Within the division there is 1 community library and 8 schools (4 primary, 2 middle, 1 special and 1 secondary)

- Colehill and Stapehill division has a total population of almost 9,300.
- The population has a slightly older age profile than the County average, 25.6% are aged 65+ years compared with 25.2% across Dorset. However there are fewer people in very old age, 3.1% compared with 4% across Dorset.

- Colehill and Stapehill has a very low proportion of both vacant properties and second/holiday homes, overall 98.2% of dwellings in the division have permanent residents.
- There is a very high proportion of households which are owner-occupied, 88% compared with 73% across Dorset.
- Car ownership is also very high, just 7% of households do not have a car.

- Overall the health of those living in Colehill and Stapehill division is better than the County average. Just 16.7% of the population in the division have a long term illness or disability, compared with 20.1% across Dorset.

- Of those who are economically active, the majority are employed full-time (51.1%). Unemployment is lower than the County average (1.9% compared with 4%).
- The majority of those who are economically inactive (16-74 years) are retired, 71.4%. Just 4.5% of the inactive population are permanently sick/disabled compared with a County average of 9.7%.
- Almost 37% have a higher level qualification (degree or above), above the County average (27%).
- The proportion employed in high skill occupations is higher than the County average at over 47%, the figure for Dorset is 40%.
