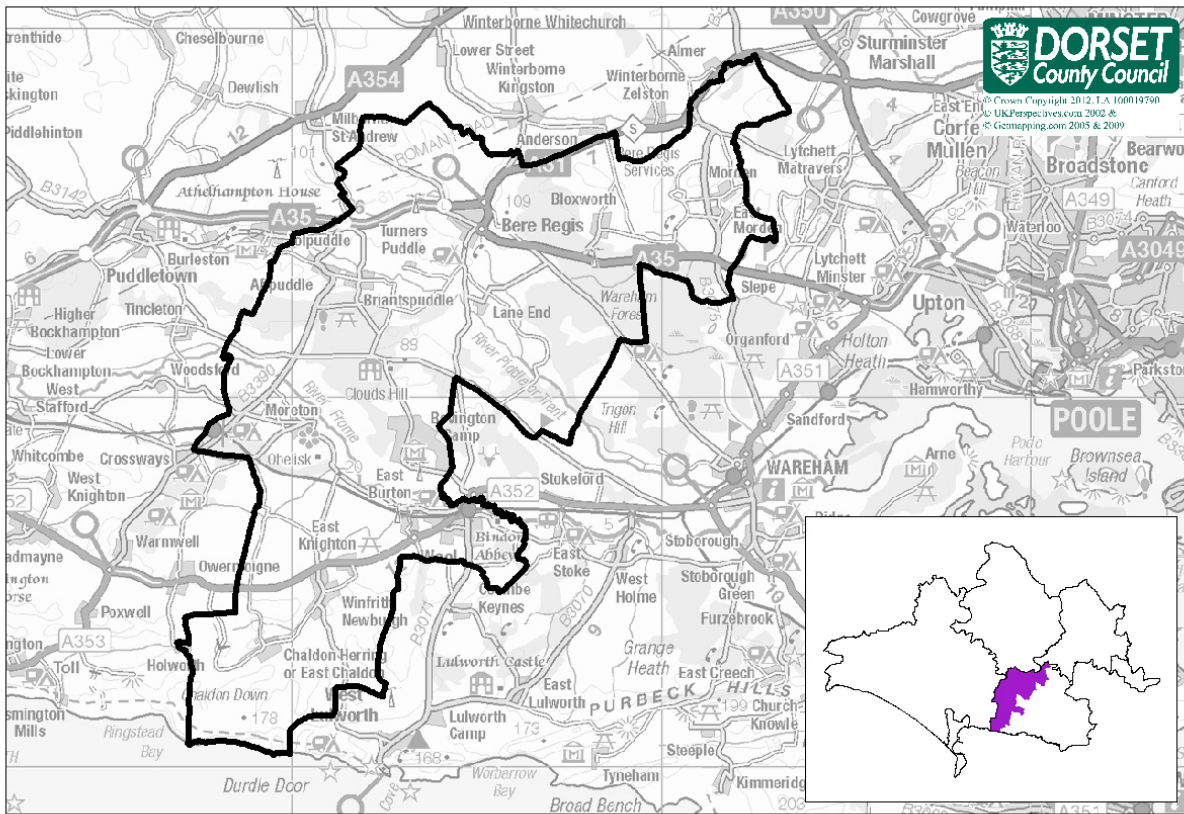


Electoral Division Profile 2013



Egdon Heath Electoral Division

Total Population: **9,200** (2011 Mid Year Estimate, DCC) Number of Electors: **7,055** (March 2013, PDC)

- Egdon Heath Electoral Division is composed of the following parishes: Morden, Bloxworth, Bere Regis, Affpuddle, Turners Puddle, Wool, Moreton, Winfrith Newburgh and Chaldon Herring
- Within the division there is 1 community library in Wool and 6 schools (5 primary and 1 middle).

- Egdon Heath division has a total population of just 9,200.
- The age profile in the division is younger than the County average. This division has a particularly low proportion of people aged 85+, 2.2% compared with 3.9% across Dorset.
- Almost 19% are aged 0-15 years, the County average is just 16.3%.

- Just 59% of households in Egdon Heath are owner occupiers, significantly lower than the County average of almost 73%.
- A large number of households in the division are rented. Over 23% are rented privately, and almost 18% from the local authority/housing association. Both figures are well above the County averages of 14.9% and 12.4% respectively.
- Car ownership is high, just 10.4% of households do not have a car and almost 46% have 2 or more cars.

- In Egdon Heath division 16.4% have a long term illness or disability, lower than the county average of 20.1%. In addition, an above average proportion are in good/very good health compared with the County average.

- The majority of those economically active are employed full-time (57.6%).
- Unemployment in the division is slightly higher than the county average, 4.2% of the economically active population compared with 4% across Dorset.
- Of those who are economically inactive, Egdon Heath has a high proportion who are looking after home/family at 14.6%. The county average is 11.3%.
- 42.5% of those in employment have a high skill occupation, slightly higher than the county average of 40%.
