

- Portland Tophill Electoral Division is composed of Tophill East Ward and Tophill West Ward.
- Within the division there is 1 library (Easton) and 4 schools (3 primary and 1 secondary).

- 77% of households in the division are owner occupied, the average across Dorset is lower at 73%.
- Car ownership is low, almost 21% of households have no car and just 31.5% have at least 2 cars, the County average is 41%.

- Overall the health of those living in Portland Tophill division is slightly better than the County average. Almost 19% of the population have a long term illness or disability, and 81% described their health as good/very good.
- 5% of the population are resident in a communal establishment, double the County average. This includes those within the prison establishments in the area.

- The majority of the economically active population are in full-time employment, 53.3%. A further 26.6% are employed part-time. The division has a very low proportion who are self-employed (11.6% compared to 18.4% across Dorset).
- Unemployment in the division is higher than average. 4.9% of the economically active population are unemployed compared with 4% across Dorset.
- Only 18% of those aged 16+ have a high level qualification (degree or above), significantly lower than the County average.
- Almost 32% of those in employment have a high skill occupations, much lower than the County average (40%).
