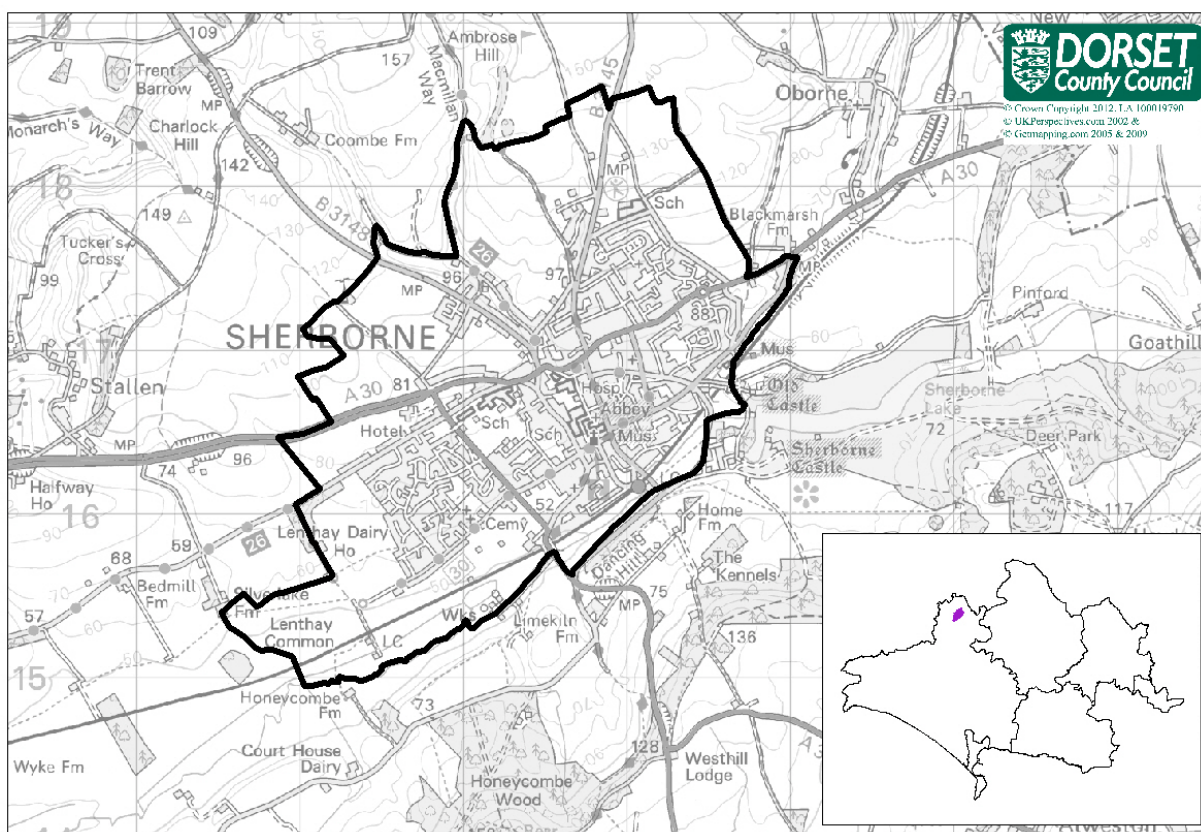


Electoral Division Profile 2013



Sherborne Electoral Division

Total Population: **9,520** (2011 Mid Year Estimate, DCC) Number of Electors: **7,105** (Dec 2012, WDDC)

- Sherborne Electoral Division is composed of Sherborne East ward and Sherborne West ward.
- Within the division there is 1 library and 3 schools (2 primary and 1 secondary).

- Sherborne Division has a total population of 9,520.
- The age profile in the division is slightly older than the County average. Almost 29% of the population are aged 65+ years compared with 25% across Dorset.
- There are a high proportion of people aged 85+ years, 5.8% compared with 3.9% across Dorset.

- Sherborne division has a high proportion of rented properties, 19.5% privately and 18.6% from the local authority/housing association. The figures for Dorset are 14.9% and 12.4% respectively.
- Car ownership is below average, 23% of households have no car and just 26.7% have 2 or more cars compared with 41% across Dorset.

- 20.5% of the population have a long term illness or disability and 79.6% described their health as good/very good, similar to the County average.
- 10% of the population in Sherborne are providing unpaid care, just below average (11.9%).
- 11.6% of the population are residents of communal establishments, significantly higher than the County average (2.3%); this is due to those boarding at schools in the town.

- Of those who are economically active, over 52% are employed full-time and 23% are in part-time employment, similar to the County average.
- Of those who are economically inactive, just under 55% are retired, much lower than the County average (63.6%). This is due to the high number of students in the town which account for almost 26% of economically inactive 16-74 year olds.
- Almost 31% of those aged 16+ in the division have a higher level qualification (degree or above), above the County average (27%).
- Of those in employment, 17.6% are in low skill occupations, across Dorset the average is 16.6%.
