- 13.3% of residents are providing unpaid care, above the County average (11.9%).

• Of those who are economically active, 45% are employed full-time and 20.8% are in part-time employment. Sherborne Rural division has a high proportion who are self-employed; over 28% of the economically active population compared with a county average of 18.4%.

- Unemployment is low as compared to the County average, 2.7% of those economically active in Sherborne Rural, 4% across Dorset.
- Just over 17% of aged 16+ in the division have no qualifications, lower than the County average (21.3%), whilst 34% have a higher level qualification, higher than average (27%).
- Of those in employment just 14.8% are in low skill occupations, across Dorset the average is 16.6%.
