- Car ownership is high, just 7.3% of households do not have a car and almost 53% have at least 2 cars, significantly higher than the County average (41%).

- Unemployment is just below the County average, 3.1% compared with 4%.
- Verwood and Three Legged Cross has a high proportion who are looking after home/family, 13.5% of the economically inactive population compared with 11.3% across Dorset.
- Over 43% of those in employment have a high skill occupation, higher than the County average (40%).
