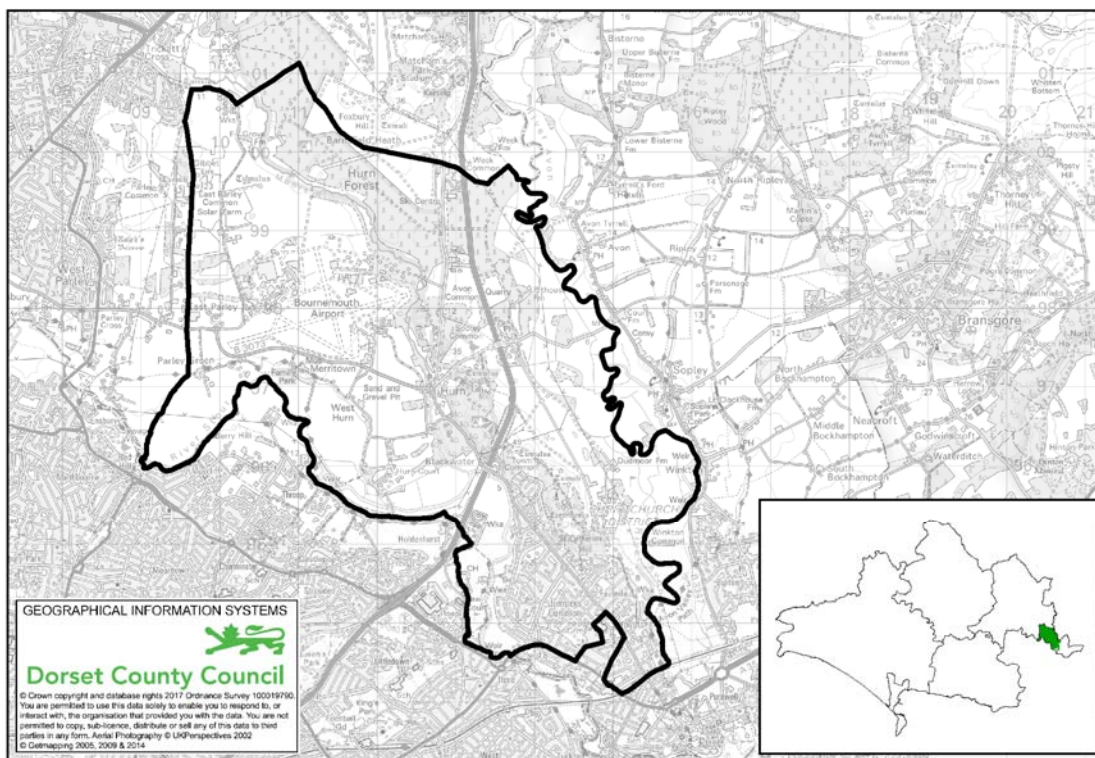


Electoral Division Profile 2017



Commons Electoral Division

Total Population: **10,500** (2015 Mid Year Estimate, DCC)

Number of Electors: **8,304** (March 2017, CBC)

- Commons Electoral Division is composed of the following wards: Jumpers ward and St Catherines & Hurn ward.
- Within the division there are no libraries. There are 3 schools (2 primary and 1 free school/academy).

- Commons division has a total population of 10,500.
- The proportion of people aged 0-15 years is 18%, compared with 16% across Dorset.
- 16-64 year olds account for approximately 56% of the population (similar to the County) while 65-84 year olds account for 22% (slightly lower than the average for Dorset).
- The proportion of people aged over 85 years is similar to the County at around 4%.
