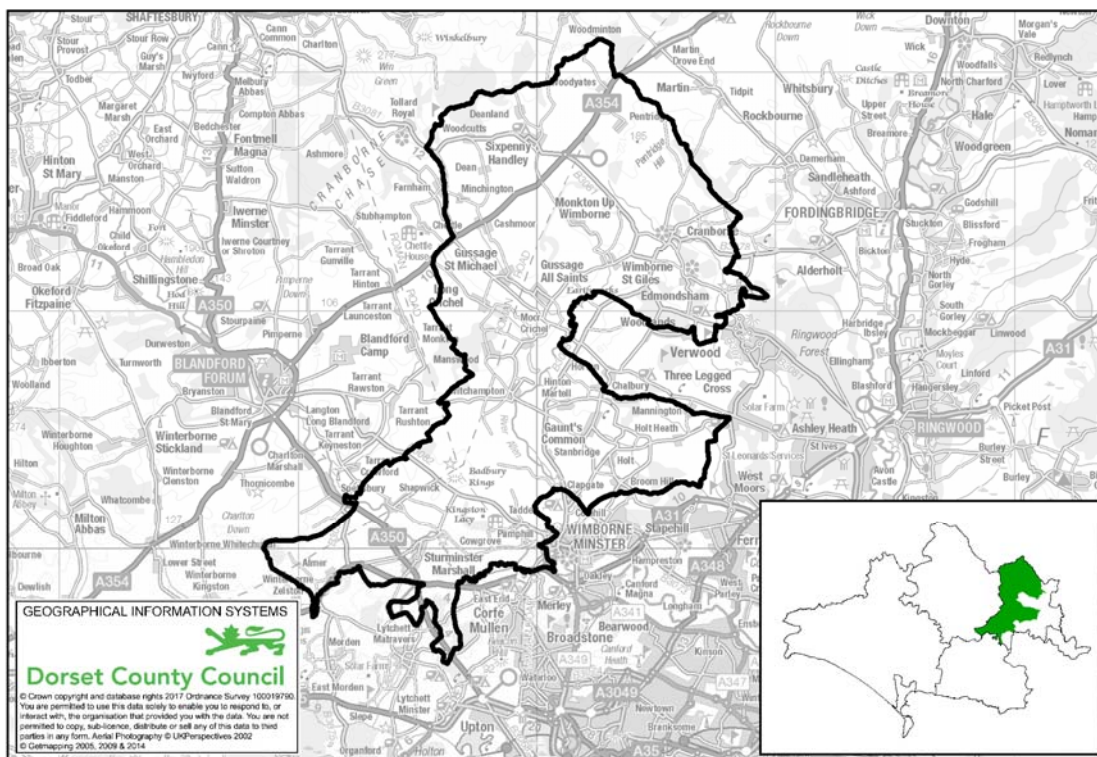


Electoral Division Profile 2017



Cranborne Chase Electoral Division

Total Population: **8,500** (2015 Mid Year Estimate, DCC) Number of Electors: **6,756** (March 2017, EDDC)

- Cranborne Chase Electoral Division is composed of the following parishes: Chalbury, Holt, Hinton, Sixpenny Handley & Pentridge, Wimborne St Giles, Cichel, Gussage St Michael, Gussage All Saints, Edmondsham, Cranborne, Witchampton, Sturminster Marshall, Pamphill and Shapwick.
- Within the division there are no libraries. There are 9 schools (7 primary, 1 middle and 1 secondary).

- Overall, the health of those living in Cranborne Chase division is better than the County average. 16.3% of the population have a long term illness or disability, compared to 20.1% across Dorset. This could be related to the slightly younger age profile of the division.
- 84.6% described their general health as very good or good and just 3.6% said their health was bad/very bad, better than the average across Dorset as a whole.
- However, a higher proportion of people provide unpaid care to a relative or friend, 12.7% compared with 11.9% for the County.

- IMD Stands for the Index of Multiple Deprivation.
- All Lower Super Output Areas in England are ranked from 1 for the most deprived to 32,844 for the least deprived.
- None of the LSOAs in Cranborne Chase ED are within the top 40% most deprived in England.
- Pamphill & Shapwick and Allen Valley are the most deprived areas in this division.
