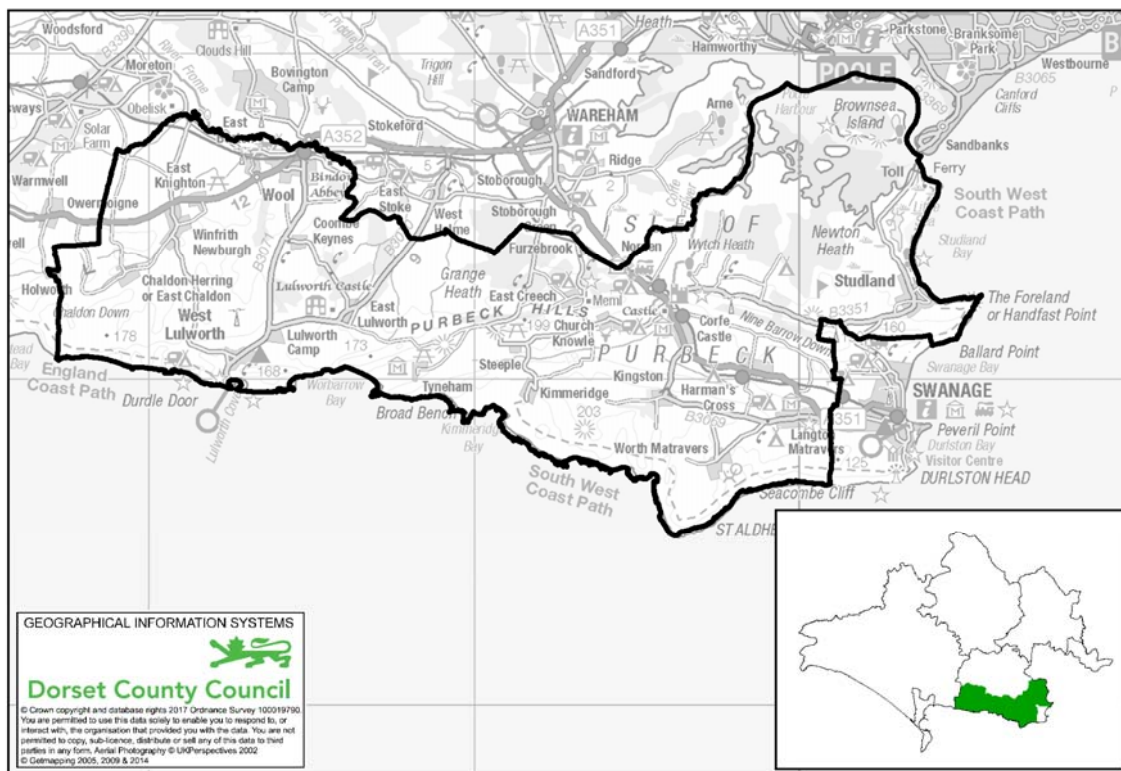


Electoral Division Profile 2017

- South Purbeck Electoral Division is composed of these parishes: Studland, Church Knowle, Corfe Castle, Worth Matravers, Langton Matravers, Kimmeridge, West Lulworth, Winfrith Newburgh, Coombe Keynes, Steeple with Tyneham, East Lulworth and Chaldon Herring.
- Within the division there are two libraries, both community-run. There are 5 schools, all primaries.
