


# Electoral Division Profile 2017



## Winterborne Electoral Division

Total Population: **8,300** (2015 Mid Year Estimate, DCC) Number of Electors: **6,399** (March 2017, NDDC)

- Winterborne Electoral Division is composed of the following parishes: Winterborne Kingston, Winterborne Whitechurch, Anderson, Charlton Marshall, Blandford St. Mary, Spetisbury, Winterborne Clenston, Bryanston, Milborne St. Andrew, Winterborne Zelston, Turnworth, Winterborne Houghton, Winterborne Stickland, Milton Abbas.
- Within the division there are no libraries (the nearest is either Blandford or Sturminster Newton). There are 5 schools (all primary).

- Winterborne division has a total population of 8,300.
- The division has a younger population than the County average, 17.5% are aged 0-15 years, compared with 16% across Dorset. The proportion of population aged 65+ (23.5%) is somewhat lower than for Dorset as a whole (27.9%).

- Overall the health of those living in Winterborne division is better than the County average, probably due to the proportion of younger people in the area.
- 17% of the population have a long term illness or disability, the County average is just over 20%.
- Over 8% of the population are resident in a communal establishment, this includes those who are at Bryanston and Milton Abbey School.
