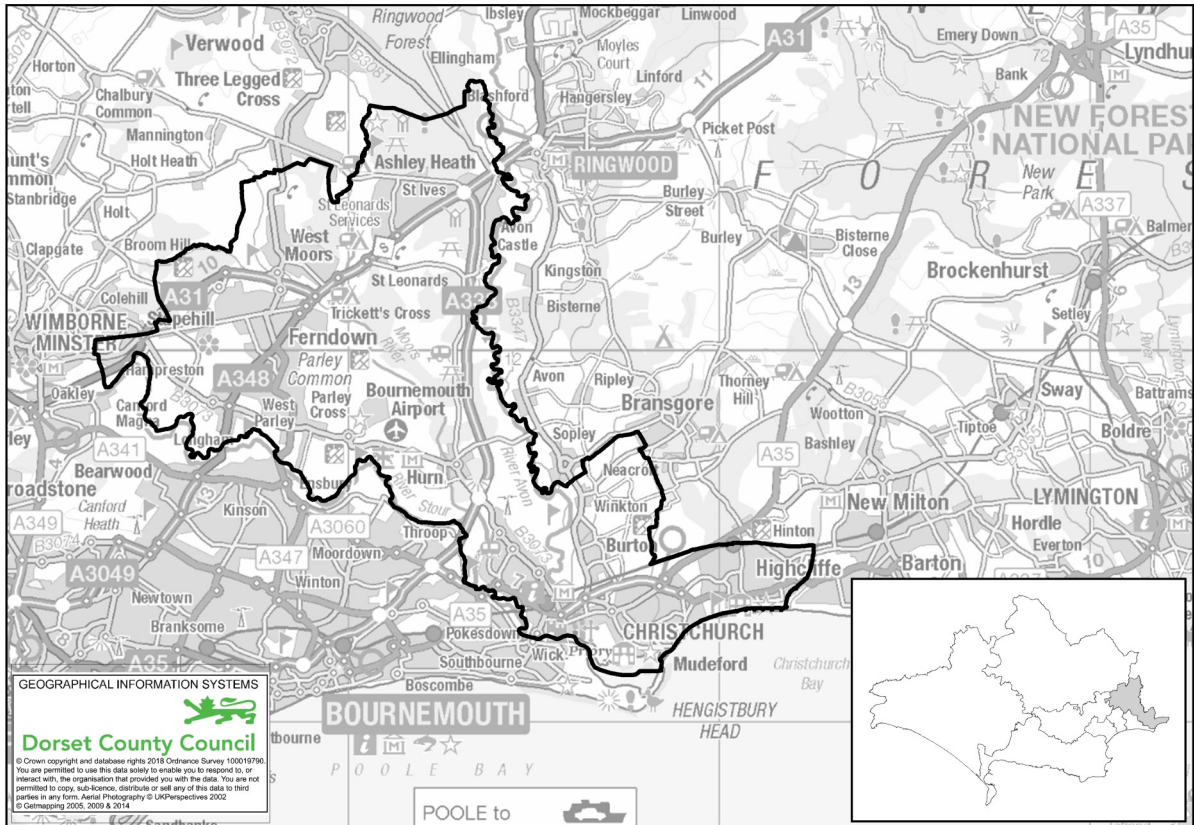

- Christchurch Parliamentary Constituency Area has a total population of 86,090.
- The area has a smaller working age population than the regional and national average with just over half aged 16-64 compared to 61% across the South West. The proportion of population aged 65+ is much larger at 35% compared to a regional 22%.
