



Notice of Modification Order

Section 53 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981

Dorset County Council County of Dorset Definitive Map and Statement of Rights of Way

Dorset County Council (Upgrading Bridleway 3, Godmanstone to Restricted Byway and adding a Restricted Byway to link with Fry's Lane, Godmanstone) **Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order 2013**

The above Order, made on 29 November 2013, if confirmed as made, will modify the definitive map and statement for the area by:

- 1. Upgrading Bridleway 3, Godmanstone in the West Dorset District to Restricted Byway (to be Restricted Byway 3) - From its junction with the unrecorded part of Fry's Lane (to be added as Restricted Byway) at SY 65859711, west south west and then west to its junction with Bridleway 5 at Crete Hill at SY 65309709. Width: 9.1 metres (30 feet)
- 2. Adding a Restricted Byway at Godmanstone in the West Dorset District (to be part of Restricted Byway 3) – From its junction with the D20717 road known as Fry's Lane at SY 65889710, west north west for a distance of 30 metres to its junction with Bridleway 3 (to be Restricted Byway 3) at SY 65859711. Width: 9.1 metres (30 feet)

A copy of the Order and the Order map may be seen free of charge at Reception, County Hall, Colliton Park, Dorchester during normal office hours. Copies of the Order and map may be bought there for £10.00. (Cheques should be made payable to Dorset County Council.)

Any representation or objection relating to the Order must be sent in writing to Vanessa Penny, Senior Rights of Way Officer, Environment Directorate, Dorset County Council, County Hall, Colliton Park, Dorchester, Dorset DT1 1XJ (Ref: RW/T384) not later than 24 January 2014, and applicants are requested to state the grounds on which it is made. Any letters received will be made available for public inspection.

If no representations or objections are duly made to the Order, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Dorset County Council, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs may itself confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State, any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent with it.
