

Notice of Confirmation of a Modification Order

Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981

Dorset County Council County of Dorset Definitive Map and Statement of Rights of Way

Dorset County Council (Bridleway 7, Piddletrenthide to be Upgraded to Restricted Byway) Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order 2015

On 10 July 2015 the Dorset County Council confirmed (without modification) the above named order as unopposed.

The effect of the order as confirmed will modify the definitive map and statement for the area by upgrading Bridleway 7, Piddletrenthide in the West Dorset District to Restricted Byway as follows:

From its junction with the C97 road, south west of Little Platt at ST 71360209, north west along a chalk surfaced track, hedged on the eastern side, to its junction with Footpath 38 at ST 71220224 and continuing generally north north west along the track, to the west of Fetchum Wood, to its junction with the current Bridleway 6, Alton Pancras at the parish boundary at ST 71130264. Width: 9.14 metres (as set out in the 1825 Plush Inclosure Award). Limitation: Field gate at ST 71130264 to BS5709:2006.

A copy of the order as confirmed and the order map have been placed and may be seen free of charge at Reception, County Hall, Colliton Park, Dorchester during normal office hours. Copies of the order and map may be bought there at the price of £10.00. (Cheques should be made payable to Dorset County Council.)

The order came into effect on 10 July 2015. If any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question its validity or that of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or of any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, you may within six weeks from 1 October 2015, make an application to the High Court.
