Dorset County Council (Bridleway 7, Piddletrenthide to be Upgraded to **Restricted Byway**) **Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order 2015**

The above Order, made on 6 February 2015, if confirmed as made, will modify the definitive map and statement for the area by upgrading Bridleway 7, Piddletrenthide in the West Dorset District to Restricted Byway as follows:

From its junction with the C97 road, south west of Little Platt at ST 71360209, north west along a chalk surfaced track, hedged on the eastern side, to its junction with Footpath 38 at ST 71220224 and continuing generally north north west along the track, to the west of Fetchum Wood, to its junction with the current Bridleway 6, Alton Pancras at the parish boundary at ST 71130264. Width: 9.14 metres (as set out in the 1825 Plush Inclosure Award). Limitation: Field gate at ST 71130264 to BS5709:2006.

Any representation or objection relating to the Order must be sent in writing to Vanessa Penny, Definitive Map Team Manager, Environment and the Economy Directorate, Dorset County Council, County Hall, Colliton Park, Dorchester, Dorset DT1 1XJ (Ref: RW/T385) not later than 3 July 2015, and applicants are requested to state the grounds on which it is made. Any letters received will be made available for public inspection.

If no representations or objections are duly made to the Order, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Dorset County Council, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs may itself confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State, any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent with it.
