**Dorset County Council (Part of Bridleway 10, Gussage All Saints (James Cross Lane) to be Upgraded to Restricted Byway)
Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order 2015**

The above Order, made on 10 July 2015, if confirmed as made, will modify the definitive map and statement for the area by upgrading part of Bridleway 10, Gussage All Saints in the East Dorset District to a Restricted Byway as follows:

From its junction with the C103 county road at ST 99351093, north north east, parallel with the Gussage St Michael parish boundary, over a red brick bridge at ST 99361096 and along an earth and grass surfaced track (known as James Cross Lane), hedged on both sides to its junction with Byway 9 and the unaffected part of Bridleway 10 at Ackling Dyke at ST 99641180. Width: 40 feet (12.19 metres) as set out in the Gussage All Saints Inclosure Award.

A copy of the Order and the Order map may be seen free of charge at Reception, County Hall, Colliton Park, Dorchester during normal office hours. Copies of the Order and map may be bought there for £10.00. (Cheques should be made payable to Dorset County Council.)

Any representation or objection relating to the Order must be sent in writing to Vanessa Penny, Regulation Team Leader, Dorset Highways, Environment and the Economy Directorate, Dorset County Council, County Hall, Colliton Park, Dorchester, Dorset DT1 1XJ (Ref: RW/T405) not later than 27 November 2015, and applicants are requested to state the grounds on which it is made. Any letters received will be made available for public inspection.

If no representations or objections are duly made to the Order, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Dorset County Council, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs may itself confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State, any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent with it.
