

## Notice of Confirmation of a Modification Order

## Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981

## Dorset County Council County of Dorset Definitive Map and Statement of Rights of Way

## Dorset County Council (Part of Bridleway 43, Sixpenny Handley and Pentridge to be Upgraded to Restricted Byway) Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order 2016

On 6 January 2017 the Dorset County Council confirmed (without modification) the above named order as unopposed.

The effect of the order as confirmed will modify the definitive map and statement for the area by upgrading part of Bridleway 43, Sixpenny Handley and Pentridge in the East Dorset District to a Restricted Byway as follows:

From its junction with Bridleway 40 and proposed Restricted Byway 61 (known as Earthpits Lane), west south west of Whitey Top Cottage at SU 03721812, east along a tarmac surfaced path, hedged on both sides, passing to the south of Whitey Top Cottage and Whitey Top Farm at SU 04091808. Continue east, crossing into a field and across the field boundary at SU 04191808 and east, across the field to its junction with Bridleway 42 and the unaffected part of Bridleway 43 at SU 04251808. The width varies: 5.8 metres at SU 03721812, 7.6 metres at SU 04091808, 4 metres at SU 04191808, widening to 11 metres at SU 04251808.

A copy of the Order and the Order map may be seen free of charge at Reception, County Hall, Colliton Park, Dorchester during normal office hours. The order came into effect on 6 January 2017. If any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question its validity or that of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or of any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, you may within six weeks from 3 March 2017, make an application to the High Court.
