Section 53 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981

Dorset County Council County of Dorset Definitive Map and Statement of Rights of Way

Dorset County Council (Bridleway 7, Anderson and Bridleway 22, Winterborne Kingston (White Lane) to be upgraded to Restricted Byways)

Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order 2015

The above Order, made on 14 August 2015, if confirmed as made, will modify the definitive map and statement for the area by upgrading Bridleways in the North Dorset District to Restricted Byways as follows:

Bridleway 7, Anderson

From its junction with Marsh Lane, south west of Muston Farm Cottages and north west of Marsh Farm at SY 87169734, south for a distance of 34 metres along a grass surfaced track (known as White Lane), hedged on both sides, to its junction with Bridleway 22, Winterborne Kingston at the Winterborne Kingston parish boundary at SY 87169730. Width: 8 metres at SY 87169734, narrowing to 6 metres at SY 87169730.

Bridleway 22, Winterborne Kingston

From its junction with Bridleway 7, Anderson, south south west of Muston Farm Cottages at the Anderson parish boundary at SY 87169730, south along a grass surfaced track (known as White Lane), for a distance of 744 metres, hedged on both sides, passing to the east of the pond and parallel with the parish boundary, to its junction with Bridleway 8, Anderson, 6 metres north of the A31 trunk road, at the Anderson parish boundary at SY 87209656. Width: 6 metres at SY 87169730, 8 metres between SY 87169730 and SY 87209656, 6 metres at SY 87209656.

A copy of the Order and the Order map may be seen free of charge at Reception, County Hall, Colliton Park, Dorchester during normal office hours. Copies of the Order and map may be bought there for £10.00. (Cheques should be made payable to Dorset County Council.)

Any representation or objection relating to the Order must be sent in writing to Vanessa Penny, Regulation Team Leader, Environment and the Economy Directorate, Dorset County Council, County Hall, Colliton Park, Dorchester, Dorset DT1 1XJ (Ref: RW/T408) not later than 26 February 2016, and applicants are requested to state the grounds on which it is made. Any letters received will be made available for public inspection.

If no representations or objections are duly made to the Order, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Dorset County Council, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs may itself confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State, any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent with it.
