

## **Notice of Modification Order**

## Section 53 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981

Dorset County Council
County of Dorset Definitive Map and Statement of Rights of Way

Dorset County Council (Bridleway 26, Osmington to be upgraded to Restricted Byway) (Part of the South West Coast Path National Trail)

Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order 2016

The above Order, made on 29 January 2016, if confirmed as made, will modify the definitive map and statement for the area by upgrading Bridleway 26, Osmington in the West Dorset District to a Restricted Byway as follows:

From its junction with Church Lane, north north west of Summerlands and Osmington village at SY 72278353, north west along an earth and stone surfaced track, hedged on both sides to SY 72108379, then north north east along the track to SY 72158411. Turn north west, along open pasture and through a small area of woodland at White Horse Hill to its junction with Footpath 23 and Bridleway 24 at the Poxwell parish boundary at SY 71858455. The width varies: 8 metres at SY 72278353, 10 metres between SY 72278353 and SY 72108379, 12 metres at SY 72108379, widening to 22 metres between SY 72108379 and SY 72158411, 22 metres at SY 72158411, narrowing to 3 metres between SY 72158411 and SY 71858455. Limitation: Field gate at SY 72158411.

Any representation or objection relating to the Order must be sent in writing to Phil Hobson, Senior Definitive Map Officer, Dorset Highways, Environment and the Economy Directorate, Dorset County Council, County Hall, Colliton Park, Dorchester, Dorset DT1 1XJ (Ref: RW/T412) not later than 26 August 2016, and applicants are requested to state the grounds on which it is made. Any letters received will be made available for public inspection.

If no representations or objections are duly made to the Order, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Dorset County Council, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs may itself confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State, any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent with it.
