On 15 September 2017 Dorset County Council confirmed (without modification) the above named order as unopposed.

The effect of the order as confirmed will modify the definitive map and statement for the area in the parish of Stoke Abbott, in the West Dorset District by adding to them:

Restricted Byway at Stoke Abbott:

(To be numbered Restricted Byway 46)

From its junction with the C77 road at Higher Farm at ST 45130033, south west along a tarmac surfaced path, passing to the west of farm buildings to its junction with the proposed new Footpath (to be numbered as part of Footpath 14) at ST 45120031. Width: 11 metres at ST 45130033, narrowing to 7 metres at ST 45120031.

Footpath at Stoke Abbott:

(To be numbered as part of Footpath 14)

From its junction with proposed Restricted Byway 46, south west of Higher Farm at ST 45120031, south west along a tarmac surfaced path, for a distance of 7.27 metres, to its junction with Footpath 14 at ST 45110030. Width: 7 metres. Limitations: Field gates at ST 45120031 and ST 45110030.

The order came into effect on 15 September 2017. If any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question its validity or that of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or of any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, you may within six weeks from 12 October 2017, make an application to the High Court.
