

Notice of Confirmation of a Modification Order

Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981

**Dorset County Council (A Footpath from Old Granary Close to
Footpath 15, Weymouth at Preston)
Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order 2017**

On 14 July 2017 the Dorset County Council confirmed (without modification) the above named order as unopposed.

The effect of the order as confirmed will modify the definitive map and statement for the area by adding a Footpath in the Weymouth and Portland Borough:-

From its junction with the adopted part of Old Granary Close, east of 15 Old Granary Close at SY 70198335, north along the adopted part of Old Granary Close and passing through a gap in the wall, north west of 14 Old Granary Close at SY 70198339. Continue south west and south, via stone and earth surfaced steps to SY 70188338, then west, via a slope with steps to the field boundary, north east of 15 Old Granary Close at SY 70178338. Continue west north west across the field to its junction with Footpath 15, north north west of 15 Granary Close at SY 70128340. Width: 2.8 metres at SY 70198335, narrowing to 1.5 metres between SY 70198339 and SY 70128340.

A copy of the order as confirmed and the order map have been placed and may be seen free of charge at Reception, County Hall, Colliton Park, Dorchester during normal office hours. The order came into effect on 14 July 2017. If any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question its validity or that of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or of any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, you may within six weeks from 24 August 2017, make an application to the High Court.
