**Dorset Council (A Footpath at School Lane, Pimperne)
Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order 2020**

The above Order, made on 6 March 2020, if confirmed as made, will modify the definitive map and statement for the area by adding to them a Footpath in the parish of Pimperne as follows:

From its junction with School Lane, south of The School House at ST 90610938, east north east along a tarmac surfaced path, fenced on the southern side to ST 9061609388 and continuing east north east, passing to the north of Harrow House and Eton House (via ST 90620939) to the western side of the sports field (of the former Pimperne First School) at ST 90630939. The width varies: 2.5 metres at ST 90610938, 2.9 metres between ST 90610938 and ST 9061609388, widening to 4.9 metres at ST 9061609388, 3.7 metres at ST 90620939 and 4.2 metres at ST 90630939. Limitation: Pedestrian gate at ST 90630939 to BS5709:2018.

If no representations or objections are duly made to the Order, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Dorset Council, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs may itself confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State, any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent with it.
