

Notice of Confirmation of a Modification Order

Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981

**Dorset County Council (A Restricted Byway, Bridport at Donkey Lane)
Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order 2018**

On 18 May 2018 the Dorset County Council confirmed (without modification) the above named order as unopposed.

The effect of the order as confirmed will modify the definitive map and statement for the area, in the parish of Bridport in the West Dorset District, by adding to them:-

A Restricted Byway at Bridport in the West Dorset District:

(To be numbered Restricted Byway 47, Bridport)

From its junction with the B3162 Dottery Road, north west of 224 North Allington Road at SY 46109391, east and east south east along a tarmac surfaced path (known as Donkey Lane), running parallel with the Allington parish boundary, to SY 46149390, north west of Meadowside. Continue east south east along a concrete surfaced path to its junction with Footpath 4, Allington, north of Meadowside at SY 46169390 and east south east to its junction with Footpath 3, Allington, north east of Meadowside at SY 46179389. Continue east south east, (via SY 46179389), across an area of grass with trees and shrubs, passing to the north of 75b Court Orchard Road, to its junction with Court Orchard Road at SY 46209387, then east south east, continuing to the Allington parish boundary, north of 79 Orchard Crescent at SY 46269387. Width: variable between 7 to 12 metres as shown shaded cross hatched on the Order plan 16/17/6.

A copy of the order as confirmed and the order map have been placed and may be seen free of charge at Reception, County Hall, Colliton Park, Dorchester during normal office hours. The order came into effect on 18 May 2018. If any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question its validity or that of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or of any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, you may within six weeks from 26 July 2018, make an application to the High Court.
