

Notice of Modification Order

Section 53 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981

Dorset County Council County of Dorset Definitive Map and Statement of Rights of Way

Dorset County Council (A Restricted Byway, Bridport at Donkey Lane) Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order 2018

The above Order, made on 9 March 2018, if confirmed as made, will modify the definitive map and statement for the area, in the parish of Bridport in the West Dorset District, by adding to them:-

A Restricted Byway at Bridport in the West Dorset District:

(To be numbered Restricted Byway 47, Bridport)

From its junction with the B3162 Dottery Road, north west of 224 North Allington Road at SY 46109391, east and east south east along a tarmac surfaced path (known as Donkey Lane), running parallel with the Allington parish boundary, to SY 46149390, north west of Meadowside. Continue east south east along a concrete surfaced path to its junction with Footpath 4, Allington, north of Meadowside at SY 46169390 and east south east to its junction with Footpath 3, Allington, north east of Meadowside at SY 46179389. Continue east south east, (via SY 46179389), across an area of grass with trees and shrubs, passing to the north of 75b Court Orchard Road, to its junction with Court Orchard Road at SY 46209387, then east south east, continuing to the Allington parish boundary, north of 79 Orchard Crescent at SY 46269387. Width: variable between 7 to 12 metres as shown shaded cross hatched on the Order plan 16/17/6.

Any representation or objection relating to the Order must be sent in writing to Vanessa Penny, Regulation Team Leader, Dorset Highways, Environment and the Economy Directorate, Dorset County Council, County Hall, Colliton Park, Dorchester, Dorset, DT1 1XJ (Ref: RW/T532) not later than 27 April 2018, and applicants are requested to state the grounds on which it is made. Any letters received will be made available for public inspection.

If no representations or objections are duly made to the Order, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Dorset County Council, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs may itself confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State, any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent with it.
