I, Rose Edwards, parish clerk, of Townsend Cottage, Poyntington, Sherborne, Dorset, DT9 4LF, acting on behalf of the Queen Thorne Parish Council, hereby apply for an order under section 53(2) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 modifying the definitive map and statement for the area by adding a Byway Open to All Traffic along the route known as Pink Knoll Hollow, starting from Point A at the junction with C143 and Sandford Orcas Road at Weathergrove Farm (at approximately ST6196 2187) eastwards to Point B (at approximately ST6251 2176) at the junction with bridleway N30/4, and the restricted byway in the Parish of Sandford Orcas.
